Indian Creek Camp-Out, Bike and Hike June 5-7

Our traditional Indian Creek Mt. bike and hike outing was another success. However, after organizing the trip for more than 6 years, this was our wettest year. We typically ride the 800 trail on Saturday from the camp area to above the Waterton Canyon, connecting to the Colorado trail. While riding the south section of the 800 trail a few days earlier to do a "Dry Run", I found flowing water on the trails with downed trees. The last bridge only crossed about 1/3 of the width of the creek. After some discussion of alternatives we decided to ride Russell Gulch, which we had never ridden. This trail was west of the campground so we ended up sharing the trail with some motorcycles. All were courteous. The trail had some challenging sections and we had a different vantage point of the Pike National forest. Friday we did a short ride up the dry section of the 800 trail. Sunday we found the Ring Tail trail was dry until just north of Roxborough State Park at which point we shortened the ride. Looking north toward Roxborough State Park from the Ring Tail trail we saw the greenest landscape we had ever seen in previous years. All the spring rain made for emerald green vistas, but delayed the blooming of the Columbine flowers.

The hiking, led by Jean and her trusty companion Umi (Jeff's dog), enjoyed at least one hike each day of the weekend. We "oohed and aahed" at views of Waterton Canyon, the front range looking north and the Divide looking northwest. Somehow, we pretty much avoided the rain during the hiking and biking. Happy Hour was happy and dry under our camper canopy until the afternoon showers passed. We even managed to have a campfire Saturday night. Those who took a chance on the weather included the hard core riders: Jeff, Fred, Russ and of course, Umi, the hiking dog. Our ski friends (and new members to DBTC) Bob and Sherrie also joined us for happy hour and a hike on Saturday. We had quite the surprise when we encountered some mercenaries on that hike!

For those who may have feared too much rain and not enough fun, they missed a great weekend.

Nearby hiking trails include Ptarmigan Lake and the Denny Creek Trail. The Ptarmigan Lake trailhead is located about 2.75 miles west of Collegiate Peaks campground. Denny Creek is located 1

mile west of the campground and accesses the Collegiate Peaks Wilderness area, Pike and San Isabel National Forest.

Many of our members love winter sports and want to continue enjoying the outdoors with their DBTC friends. The DBTC Message Board will be our main means of communication through the winter months. If you'd like to post an event, simply go into the site. Remember not all members have email so if you have it in the newsletter all members are notified.

Rides are cancelled if the temperature is below 40 degrees at start time or it is raining or snowing. Be ready to start at the time listed – tires pumped up and bike ready. The ride leader is not a mechanic so if your bike needs repair, please take it to the shop.

Ride Locator: There is a guide to the most frequent start locations on our website – www.dbtc.org. It provides the information you need to use Map Quest or Google Maps to make a map to the starting location.

DBTC's E-Mailing Lists

Get late breaking news, last minute ride updates, and short-notice of weekday rides, all e-mailed directly to you as soon as the information is posted. If the weather is "iffy", a ride leader can post a notice to let you know if the ride will go or be cancelled.

If you have registered with MeetUp, we will post your scheduled rides.
